CITY OF PORT LINCOLN - ANNUAL BUSINESS PLAN SUMMARY 2018/2019

The 2018/2019 City of Port Lincoln Annual Business Plan sets out Council's proposed services, programs and projects for the financial year and a review of achievements against Council's objectives for the 2017/2018 financial year.

This Summary provides an overview of our 2018/2019 Annual Business Plan, some of the factors that shaped the Plan, and information on the rating and other revenue sources.

Council will continue to provide efficient services for the community and advance the objectives of Council's Strategic **Directions Plan.**

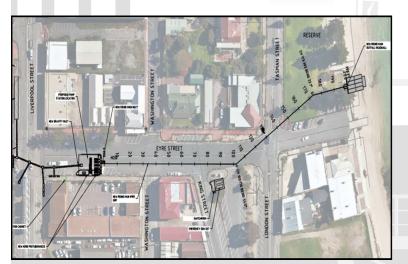
The specific objectives for the year are consistent with Council's Long Term Financial Plan and Infrastructure and Asset Management Plan, to ensure the long-term sustainability of the Council's financial performance.

SHAPING OUR PLAN

A number of external and internal factors have shaped our Plan for 2018/2019, including infrastructure priorities, efficiency improvements, cost increases, grant revenues and funding partnerships.

Key commitments in the Plan include:

- Liverpool Street Stormwater Pump Station Upgrade \$3.2 million;
- Leisure Centre Expansion Project, fully funded through the Commonwealth Development Grant Funding Program \$2.7 million;
- Continued Road Reseal work at \$660,000 per year;
- Upgrade of the Parnkalla Trail Wharf Precinct \$400,000.

FUNDING OUR PLAN

Council's adopted budget for 2018/2019 includes a combined capital and operational expenditure of \$29 million which will be funded from a variety of recurrent and grant revenue sources. Our operating revenue is predominantly raised from rates and service charges, being approximately 72% of the operational income. The remaining 28% of funding comes from State and Commonwealth Governments grants, statutory charges, user charges, reimbursements and commercial income.

RATES

Council rates have been determined using 'site value' as the basis for valuing land in the Council area for 2018/2019.

The Budget will raise:

- General Rate Revenue of \$11.447 million, including new assessments, with 31% being raised from the Fixed Charge component and 69% from the Rate in the Dollar component;
- A Fixed Charge of \$435 per assessment for all rateable land (excluding Marina Berths) included in the General Rate;
- Combined Service Charges totalling \$310.15 for Waste (\$256.75 per assessment) and Recycling (\$53.40 per assessment, excluding vacant land and Marina Berths) to those properties where the service is provided or made available.

PAYMENT OF RATES

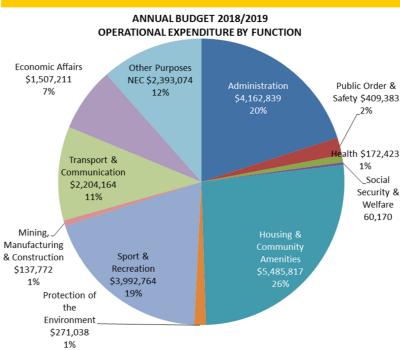

DISCOUNT FOR EARLY PAYMENT

Council grants a discount pursuant to Section 181(11) (b) of the Local Government Act 1999, amounting to 2% of the total rates (excluding NRM Levy or Waste or Recycling Charges) if paid in full on or before 14 September 2018.
