



## Who can apply?

Applications are being invited from community groups and private individuals and/or businesses who would like to use the salvaged timber from the recently refurbished Port Lincoln Town Jetty. Applicants who have already submitted applications do not need to reapply.

#### What timber is available?

The salvaged timber available includes old decking, kerbing, girders, and other components of the old Port Lincoln Town Jetty along with some new decking timber that was rejected during the construction process. The timber varies in quality, and may contain metal pins, nails and bolts. Some of the timber may have been treated with oils, solvents and chemicals and other substances including creosote. Timber will generally be sold in lots/ bundles.

The timber has been graded into four categories:

- 1. Excellent condition Highest grade timber
- 2. Good condition
- 3. Fair condition intended for small scale domestic and community use
- 4. Poor condition limited re-use sold by trailer load

## How much will the timber cost?

Timber for eligible community projects, will be provided at no cost for projects that demonstrate local community benefit and are publicly accessible.

The cost of timber for private individuals/business use will depend on the quality of timber chosen. Timber graded as:

- 1. Excellent condition and 2. Good condition will be sold at a commercial price.
- 3. Fair condition will be sold at market value suitable for domestic or creative purposes.
- 4. Poor quality

Note: A minimum reserve price for the higher graded timber (1-3) sold to private individuals and businesses has been set to go towards offsetting the cost of renewing the jetty.

# What are eligible Community Projects?

Eligible community projects are community-initiated projects by incorporated not-for-profit organisations that benefit the local community and are accessible to the public.

We work on Barngarla Country. The City of Port Lincoln acknowledges Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the First Australians and their continuing connection to land, sea, culture and community. We pay respect to Elders past, present and emerging and are committed to working together on our reconciliation journey.

Applicants will need to demonstrate their plans for their community project are well developed, feasible and do not require any additional approvals.

Applicants will need to provide:

- A statement relating to the purpose, vision and/or values of your organisation and its local membership.
- A plan for the use of the timber including a sketch, diagram or similar.
- The quantity of timber required for the project, including preferred grade and lot # (refer to the timber grading matrix).
- How the project will offer a community benefit and be accessible to the public.

#### **Inspection of Timber**

There will be an opportunity to inspect the timber at the City of Port Lincoln's Operations Depot at 33 Bel-Air Drive, Port Lincoln on:

Tuesday 19 March (10.00 am and 12 noon)

Pedestrian access only at the third gate not the main Depot gate.

#### **Indemnity and Waiver**

The timber varies in quality, and may contain metal pins, nails, and bolts. Some of it has been treated with oils, solvents, chemicals and other substances including creosote and is not suitable for firewood. The timber is not certified for structural use and must not be used for the construction of buildings. All community groups, private organisations, and individuals will be required to sign an indemnity and waiver form before timber is collected.

# **Assessment of Applications**

Applications will be assessed by an internal assessment panel made up of Council senior staff with recommendations to be approved by Council's Chief Executive Officer. All Applicants will be notified about the success of their application.
