#### 1. PURPOSE

- **1.1.** To provide clear guidelines for the safe management and maintenance of Councils public playgrounds.
- **1.2.** To provide guidance on the standards of provision and future direction in the development of Councils playgrounds with respect to the community's current and future needs.

## 2. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

Local Playground: Small scale playground aimed at serving the immediate residents

within 300-500m (10 minute walk).

Neighbourhood Playground: Slightly larger than local playgrounds with more equipment/facilities

and a catchment area of approximately 1 kilometre.

Regional Playground: Usually combined with other recreational activities and located on

larger reserve areas serving a catchment of 2-3km.

Soft Fall: The surface underneath and around the playground that provides an

impact absorbing layer in the event of a fall from the playground

equipment.

#### 3. PRINCIPLES

## 3.1. Safety and Compliance

3.1.1 The construction and maintenance of playground equipment will be carried out according to Australian Standards for Playgrounds (AS/NZ5 4486.1:1997, AS/NZ5 4222:1996, AS 4685: (parts 1-6)2014).

- **3.1.2** Playgrounds containing sand soft fall will be raked weekly to remove debris and to maintain the minimum required depth.
- 3.1.3 All playground equipment including the depth of soft fall will be inspected monthly by the Operations Department utilising Councils Inspection/Maintenance Form (Template 16-55-T3)
- 3.1.4 That where a hazard or non-compliance issue has been identified, corrective action be taken without delay. Where the defect cannot be immediately repaired, the item shall be secured against further use or removed.
- 3.1.5 When using sand as soft fall, the most compliant local sands can be sourced from Yelloroo Quarries (Poonindie) or Warrayappa Sands (Cowell). This was determined by the 2010 DECS (Department for Education of Childrens Services) Report on "Testing of sand as an impact attenuating surface in Eyre Peninsula playgrounds".

#### 4. PARK AND PLAYGROUND GUIDELINES

- **4.1.** Develop a regional level adventure playground given Port Lincoln's status as a regional centre.
- **4.2.** Supplement the play experiences offered by commercial play infrastructure with more 'nature play' facilities and consider facilities targeted to different age groups.
- **4.3.** Continue to upgrade existing playgrounds according to Council's Infrastructure and Asset Management Plan.
- **4.4.** Ensure that urban areas are appropriately serviced with adequate access to playground facilities at Neighbourhood and Regional Level playgrounds.

**4.5.** Commence planning for possible future development of playground facilities in areas where there are existing gaps in provision (e.g. Northern and Western suburban areas).
