COUNCIL ADOPTS NEW BY-LAWS TO COME INTO OPERATION ON 6 NOVEMBER 2018

The City of Port Lincoln Council has completed the review of its current suite of By-laws as required under Section 246 of the Local Government Act 1999, after considering referrals from the Dog and Cat Management Board, Minister for Transport and Infrastructure and feedback from the community. The five By-laws were adopted at the Ordinary Council meeting held on Monday 18 June 2018.

The adopted By-laws are:

1. [Permits and Penalties By-law No. 1 of 2018](#);
2. [Moveable Signs By-law No. 2 of 2018](#);
3. [Roads By-law No. 3 of 2018](#);
4. [Local Government Land By-law No. 4 of 2018](#); and
5. [Dogs By-law No. 5 of 2018](#).

The By-laws have been referred to the Legislative Review Committee and were published in the Government Gazette on 5 July 2018. The By-laws will come into operation on Tuesday 6 November 2018, four months after the gazetted date, in accordance with section 249(5) of the Local Government Act 1999.

Mayor Bruce Green said, “By-Laws are local laws designed to ensure the action of an individual or group does not have an adverse impact on the environment, public property, or the comfort, health and safety of others in the community. By-laws are legally enforceable and will be reviewed again in 2025”.
