COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT BEGINS FOR CITY PRECINCT MASTER PLANNING

Port Lincoln businesses and the community will have an opportunity to share their experiences of our city and their aspirations for its future at a major “Co-Design Workshop” on December 6 and 7. The workshop is part of a new consultation process for developing master plans for the foreshore, CBD and marina areas of the city.

Chief Executive Officer Stephen Rufus said “The precinct master plans will establish a shared vision for the long-term future of the City”.

“We invite the community to be involved throughout the master planning process, as we work with a highly talented group of planning and design experts to produce outstanding master plans for our three key precincts and detailed design work for the foreshore in particular,” Mr Rufus said.

“This is a fantastic opportunity to strengthen the city through liveability, tourism, recreation and economic development while preserving and making visible our culture and historic character”.

“The master plans will include input from community, industry, neighbouring Councils, Regional Development Australia Whyalla and Eyre Peninsula and the South Australian Tourism Commission”.

Mayor Brad Flaherty said “The co-design sessions offered residents and businesses the perfect opportunity to meet consultants Jensen Plus and have their views heard on the future of the City of Port Lincoln”.

Information collected at the co-design sessions will feed into the preparation of Draft Precinct Master Plans and detailed designs for the foreshore environs. Stakeholders will be able to put forward their vision for the future of the City of Port Lincoln and contribute to setting the direction of the master planning process.
